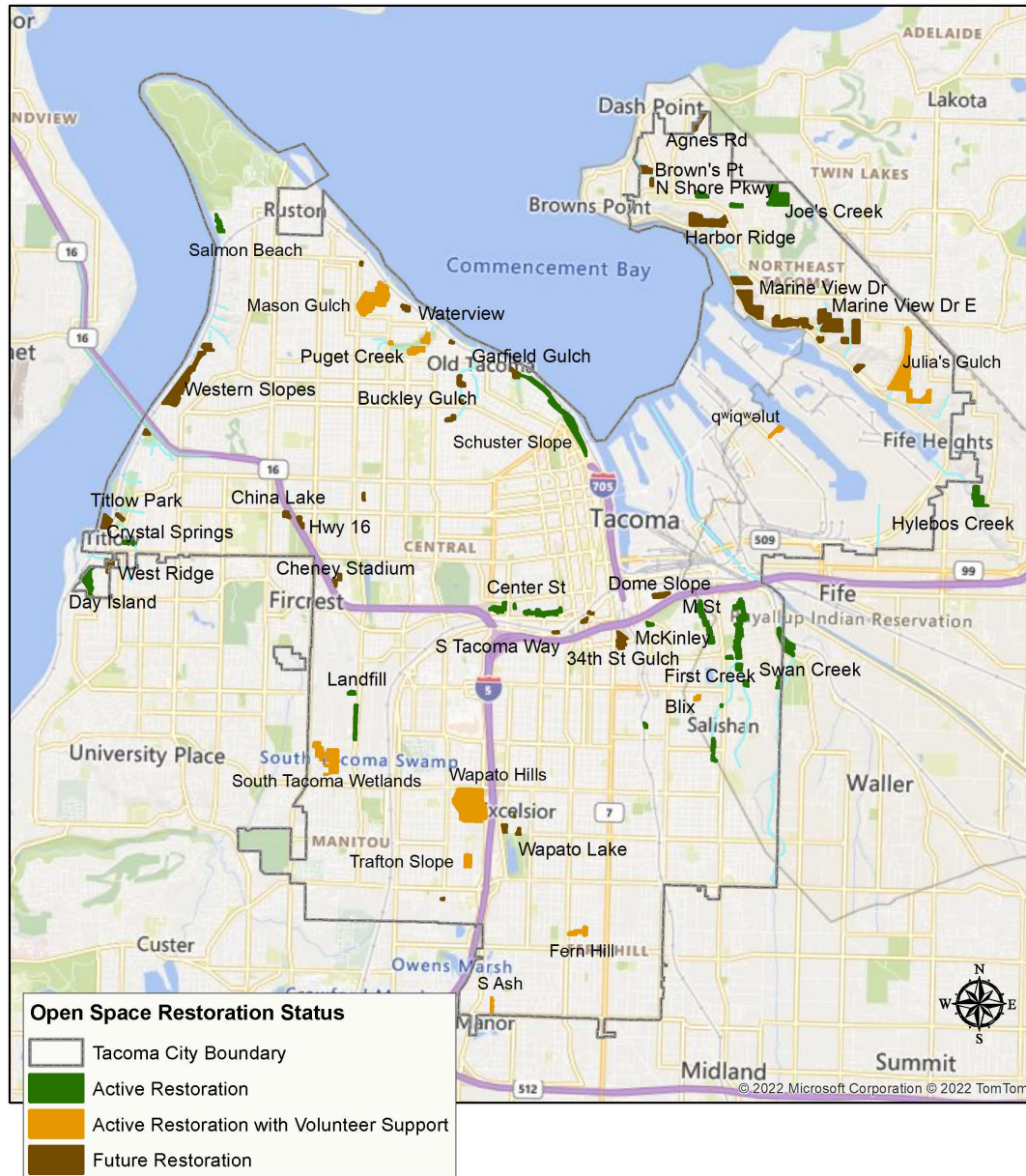
Passive Open Space

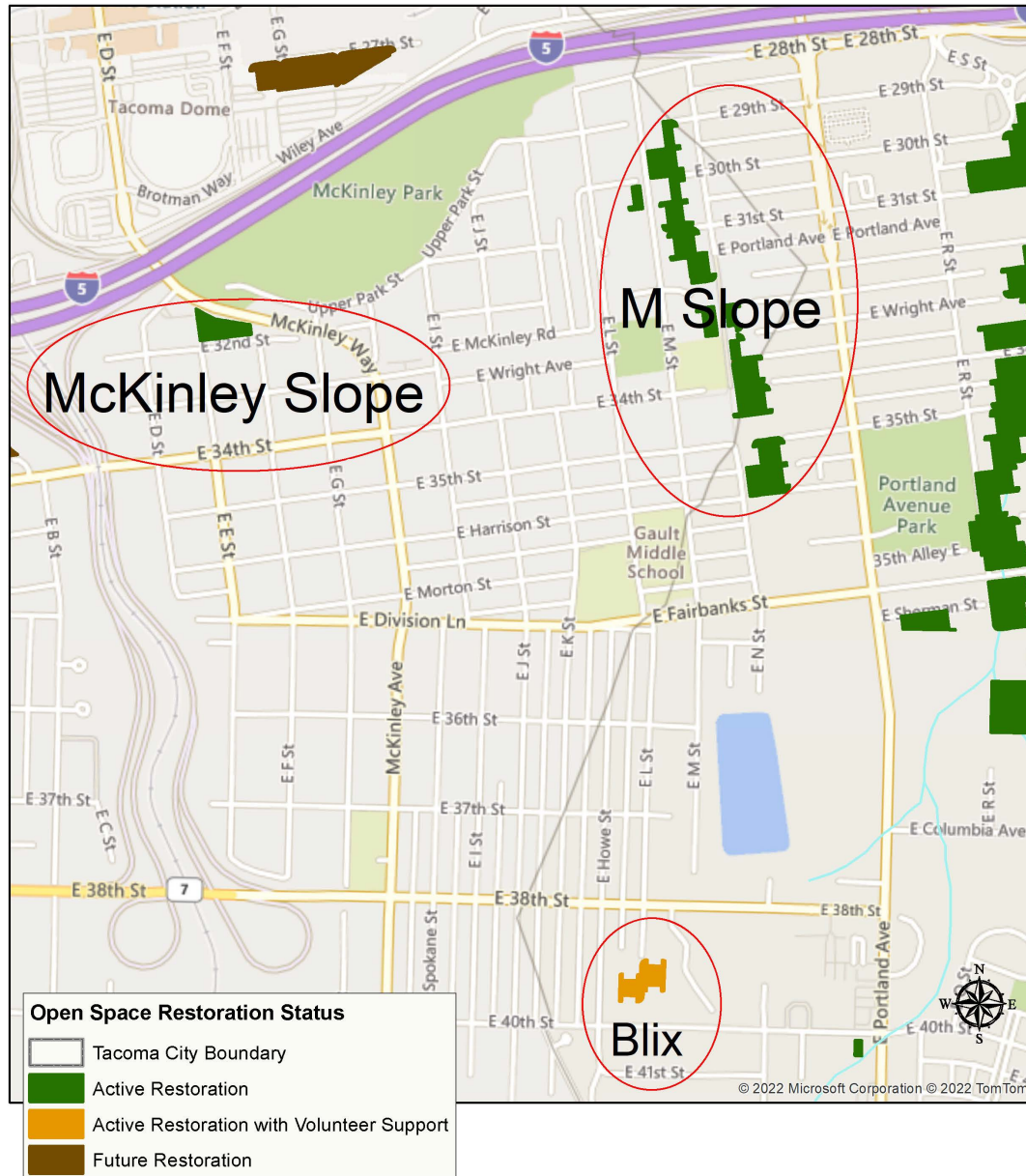
- Natural “wild” areas

Benefits of Urban Forests

- ▣ Slows, retains, and filters stormwater
- ▣ Tree roots stabilize soils on steep slopes and help prevent erosion
- ▣ Provide wildlife habitat

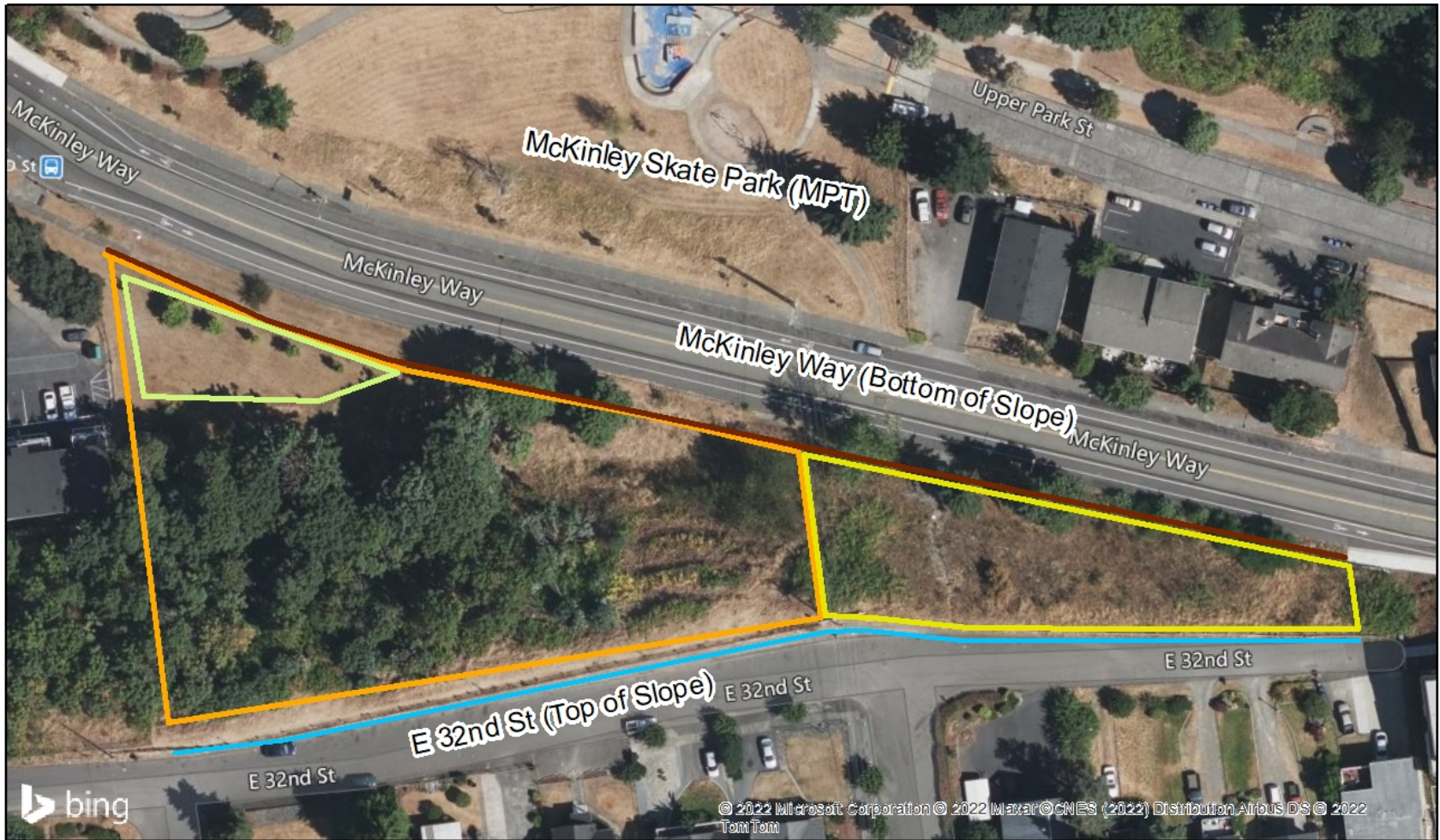

Restoration improves water quality, air quality and neighborhood pride.

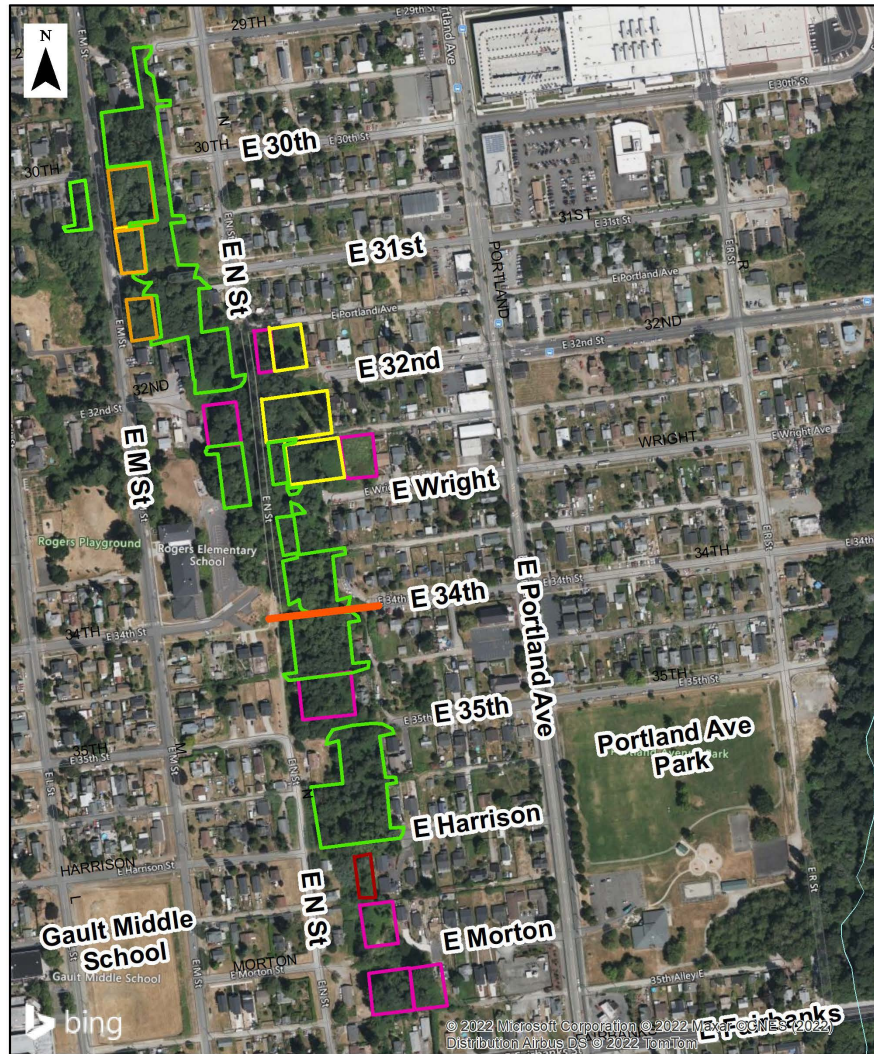

- ❑ Clean up costs in 2021 almost \$18,000
- ❑ Costs almost cut in half during the purple bag pilot
- ❑ Numerous unsheltered persons connected with services in 2021 & 2022

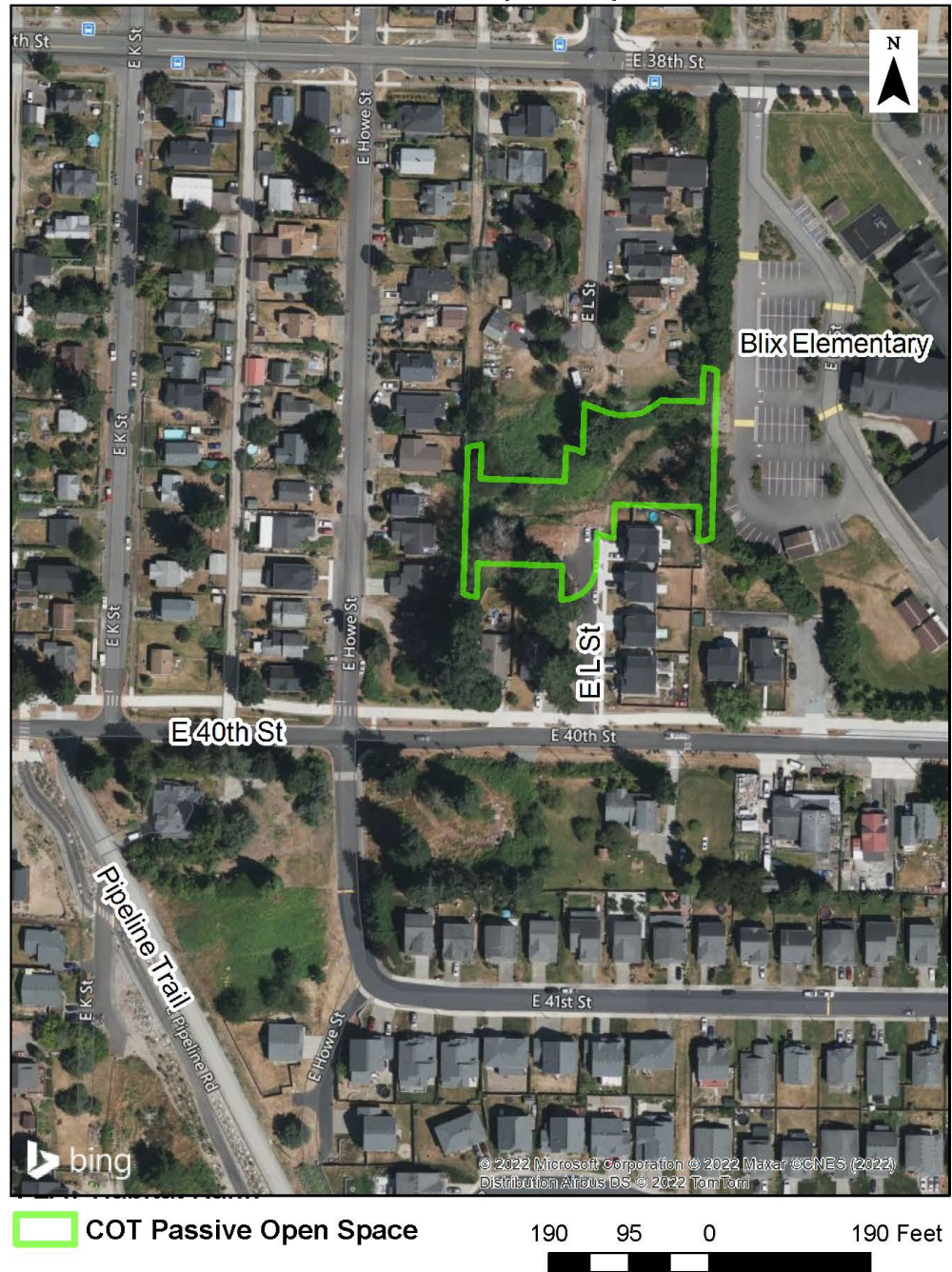
M Slope Ideas

- ❑ Volunteer restoration program on flat areas
- ❑ Work with tribe to develop a joint long-term restoration plan
- ❑ Develop a foraging trail along E. N St and any new paths/walkways that are installed to replace the steps (there is currently no plan to replace the steps).
- ❑ Install signage identifying the significance of certain plants to the tribe in both English and Lushootseed.

Blix Passive Open Space

- ☐ Volunteers have restored a significant portion of site
- ☐ Habitat steward needed
- ☐ Volunteer work party Sat, June 25th from 9-noon (see Forterra website to sign up)
