# Attendee Message to Host & Moderator:

- 1. For narrow and deep lots, can the vegetated dispersion flowpath be located in the 5' side setback with the flowpath being parallel to the side property line? The infeasibility criteria has a limit of not closer than 10' from the property line and the detail shows the flowpath perpendicular to the property line.
- 2. For narrow and deep lots, can the dispersion trench length of 10 feet be reduced to 2 feet to be centered in a 5' setback?

#### Response:

- 1. As of our 2026 draft SWMM, stormwater facilities must be set back from property lines. With the most-recent Zoning Updates, including Unit Lot Subdivision (aka Home In Tacoma), the Stormwater Comprehensive Plan, which is currently in development, will include recommendation for any updates to the infeasibility criteria that may need to be evaluated.
- 2. How the flows are collected/which BMP is specifically used, would be considered to answer the flowpath orientation question. In general though, for dispersion flowpaths, the questions may be more aligned with the overall geometry of the site: the dispersion trench must be aligned perpendicular to the flowpath.

# **Attendee Message to Host & Moderator:**

For roof and pavement drainage management on compact lots, can site runoff continue to collect and convey offsite routing under the sidewalk to gutter?

#### Response:

Short answer: Yes.

Longer answer: Collect and convey is still an option for stormwater management if: all MR #5 BMPs are deemed infeasible, the project does not require flow control per MR 7 or Infrastructure Protection, or treatment per MR 6.

As Mieke noted, there may be future updates to the SWMM to address small lot development (ie: Unit Lot Subdivision, Home In Tacoma). The Stormwater Comprehensive Plan, which is currently in development, will include any recommend updates to the infeasibility criteria in consideration of small lots.
